The members of Glendale Kiwanis pride ourselves on our active participation in our community. As such, we always stay informed on news that concerns the people of Glendale. And what better way to do that is with a report by the **104**th **Precinct Community Affairs Bureau.** Det. Mike Berish was on hand to give us a rundown of local concerns and helpful hints on how we can help local enforcement. Among other things:

- Car thefts are up across the precinct, especially Honda CRVs. Apparently, electronic keys can be easily duplicated, and cars can be started and driven away on the LIE or the Jackie Robinson Pkwy.
- A recent surge in medical bill scams, where residents receive fraudulent bill collection notices from 3rd party collectors.
- Chain snatchers on scooters approach pedestrians and grab their loose jewelry and ride off.
- Amazon, FedEx and UPS package thieves follow trucks and grab unsecured packages seconds after delivery.

On a more positive note:


- Twelve new police officers have been added to the 104th Precinct to help with understaffing.
- Three illegal cannabis shops have been closed.
- Over fifty illegal scooters and electric bikes have been confiscated and destroyed.
- RING doorbell cameras have been helping police develop a database of repeat offenders, leading to arrests.

Det. Berish advised everyone to continue to keep their guard up, and report any illegal activity to the precinct as soon as possible. Keep your cars and homes locked, ignore threatening mail scams asking for money, arrange for secure package drop offs with neighbors or friends, and consider getting security cameras. He had a fantastic amount of information, and it is always good to see our men and women in Blue.



The second portion of our program was a report from our City Councilman (and dues paying member) Robert Holden. He is always a great source of information about our city and our neighborhood. Not always the best news, but he always tells it like it is. Among the things he discussed:

- The "City of Yes". The City wants more housing, and is willing to overcrowd neighborhoods by expanding zoning rules to make basement apartments and garage apartments legal. Bob said that infrastructure (sewers, electrical grids, roads) need to be upgraded first.
- Immigrants are entering the city at 100k because the City wants to be a sanctuary city no matter the cost, and is willing to protect immigrants from vetting by ICE. Bob wrote a letter to Mayor Adams opposing these outrageous policies.
- E-Bikes are a blight. Besides being unregistered, the majority of owners blatantly ignore traffic rules, making it unsafe for pedestrians and motorists. Plus, illegal lithium-ion batteries are a danger because of fires during recharging. The City, with the FDNY, are launching the NYC Safe Charging Accelerator, an effort for property owners to install public battery charging stations on city sidewalks. These stations will allow for safe battery charging and swapping, increasing compliance with safety regulations and protecting the lives of New Yorkers.







On July 20th, Queens West Division hosted our annual *Governor's Visit*. This year, Lt Governor Janice Bar put together an amazing event, setting up a dinner cruise from the World's Fair Marina. Governor Lucien Giancursio and Heather had a great time. We had a fantastic afternoon sailing down the East River past Manhattan down

to the Statue of Liberty. We had a tasty buffet lunch, clubs presented Governor Lucien and Heather with gifts, and everyone had some fun being serenaded by our club. It was a fun day on the water.
