We wrapped up the third month of this service year with our meeting at Zum Stammtisch. DPP Steven Hansen was our 'President for a Day', and he opened the meeting in the usual manner; Karen Kramer delivered a fine Invocation, asking for blessing for all first responders. After the Pledge and our Patriotic Song, Steve asked for a moment of silence for the passengers of the plane crash in DC. He walked the room and introduced our Past Leadership. He had an easy time of it, since there were only a few in attendance.

Today's Guests: DPP Big Bill Maher introduced his lunch guest, Pat; Vin Arcuri had his aide Maria along again.

Our special guest speaker today was Retired Firefighter Jim Jacobs, formerly with Engine 286 in Glendale. After a 'How Do You Do' greeting, he presented a program about the *Tunnel to Towers Foundation*. He began with the story of Firefighter Stephen Siller. On September 11, 2001, Stephen, who was assigned to Brooklyn's

Squad 1, had just finished his shift and was on his way to play golf with his brothers when he got word over his scanner of a plane hitting the North Tower of the World Trade Center. Upon hearing the news, Stephen called his wife Sally and asked her to tell his brothers he would catch up with them later. He returned to Squad 1 to get his gear. Stephen drove his truck to the entrance of the Brooklyn Battery Tunnel, but it had already been closed for security purposes. Determined to carry out his duty, he strapped 60 lbs. of gear to his back, and raced on foot through the tunnel to the Twin Towers, where he lost his life while saving others.

Born from the tragedy of 9/11, the *Tunnel to Towers Foundation*, cofounded by his brother Frank, carries out its mission to "do good," by providing mortgage-free homes to Gold Star and fallen first responder families with young children and by building specially-adapted smart homes for catastrophically injured veterans and first responders. Tunnel to Towers is also committed to ending veteran homelessness and helping America to 'Never Forget September 11'. Since its inception, the Foundation has been committed to practicing sound



fiscal management, organizational efficiency and program integrity. Tunnel to Towers keeps fundraising and administrative costs at a minimum, with only a small percentage of funds allocated to overhead expenses. The Foundation's program service percentage on average is 93% – 93 cents out of every dollar goes directly to programs and services. Jim stated that the large grants from corporations such as Home Depot are important, but the \$11/month donations from individuals are the lifeblood of the foundation.

Our club first honored Tunnel to Towers at our First Responders Community Day in 2019, and have donated to their cause every year since.
